

The **Georgia Rotary Student Program (GRSP)** offers comprehensive scholarships to students from all over the world to study at university level in the state of Georgia (USA) for one academic year. The overall aim of the GRSP scholarship is to promote peace and understanding through the means of education.

Applicants to the GRSP program are identified through the worldwide network of Rotary Clubs and therefore apply as candidates through their local Rotary Club.

**Nesbru Rotary Club**, in collaboration with **Nesbru VGS**, is now searching for applicants for the GRSP scholarship for the academic year of **2019-2020**. All students who are interested are encouraged to contact us to receive further information about the scholarship and the application process. Applicants must be between 18 and 24 years old and must have completed high school by the spring of 2019. Therefore both 12th year (vg2) and 13th year (vg3) students are currently eligible to apply.

The scholarship covers all expenses such as tuition, housing, meal plans and fees for the students for the entire year. If students wish to stay at their designated university to continue their studies at their own expense this is entirely possible. Students are at liberty to choose the course of their studies, with the only exceptions of medicine and odontology.

Students who are chosen for the GRSP will be hosted by a local Rotary club in Georgia and attend a university within the state. Students are accommodated by campus housing, and have the chance to travel with the other GRSP students to exciting parts of Georgia throughout the entire year. Being a part of this program is an excellent chance to study abroad, explore different courses of studies, improve your skills in English, travel in the US and contribute to the Rotary community through sharing knowledge and experiences.

What students must organize and cover the expenses of:

- The application itself (including a cover letter, letters of recommendation and academic transcripts).
- Travelling to and from the United States.
- Insurance.
- Mandatory tests: TOEFL and SAT-1.
- Student visa (the GRSP will guide students in this process and cover the expense of the actual visa, however there are some fees in the process of obtaining the visa that students must cover themselves).
